

Cougar Family Memorial Park



Science Department




leading lady, a corpse that can't play dead, and actors who trip over everything (including their lines), it's an exciting way to spend the evening.

The Boys Swim Team went back to competing in a full season schedule this past year and welcomed Conant Grad and new diving coach Pablo Ramirez ('09) to the staff. The season included more than 80 athletes practicing hard and competing extremely well after 2 rough years of COVID. The Varsity team finished the Dual Meet season with a 3-4 record.

The team finished 6th at the Varsity Conference Meet held at Elk Grove High School. At the Varsity Conference Meet Bryce Loeger (So.) finish 1st in the 50 Free (21.57); Alex Seeman (Fr.) finished 6th in the 100 Free (50.51); Ayden Woo (Fr.) finished 6th in the 500 Free (4:57.76); the 200 Free Relay team of Spencer Vecchione (Sr.), Tyler Mitsuyasu (Sr.), Ayden Woo and Alex Seeman finished 6th (1:33.50); Bryce Loeger finished 2nd in the 100 Back (53.21); and the 400 Free Relay team of Alex Seeman, Ayden Woo, Spencer Vecchione and Bryce Loeger finished 5th (3:21.39.

The team finished 6th at the IHSA Sectional Meet held at Prospect High School. Bryce Loeger finished 2nd in the 50 Free (21.35) and 1st in the 100 Free (46.72) qualifying for the state meet in both events. KarlHeintz Megger finished 7th in the Diving and qualified for the State Meet. Ayden Woo finished 5th in the 500 Free (4:53.89). Alex Seeman, Spencer Vecchione, Ayden Woo and Bryce Loeger teamed up in the 200 Free Relay to finish 5th (1:29.19) and again in the 400 Free Relay to finish 4th (3:16.46).

At the State Meet held (for the first time) at the FMC Natatorium in Westmont, Bryce Loeger finished 16th in the 50 Free (21.33) and 17th in the 100 Free (46.88). He now holds the 2nd fastest time in Conant history for both events.

Coach Brian Drenth ('96) is excited to invite alumni back this year for our Alumni Meet held on Saturday December 17th beginning at 10am.



Girls Swimming






Girls Water Polo


