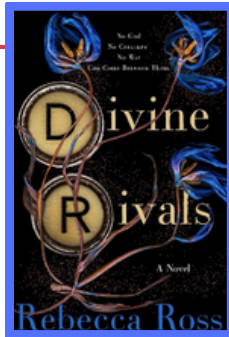
Please stop by the library and share what book made you fall in love from the very first chapter. It is easy - just write down the title of the book and post your response on the tree display in the library.

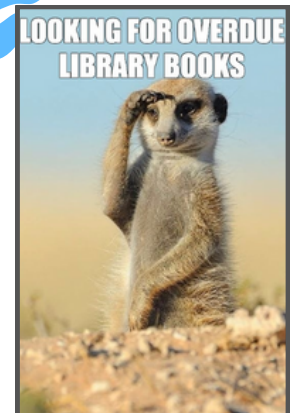


CREATIVE CORNER

The first Little Free Library was built in 2009 in Hudson, Wisconsin. Todd H. Bol built the first Little Free Library in 2009, as a tribute to his mother who had passed away.

There are more than 190,000 Little Free Libraries worldwide.

Little Free Libraries are located in all 50 states, 128 countries, and on every continent except Antarctica.

Little Free Libraries are book-sharing boxes that are placed in public spaces.

Little Free Libraries are intended to increase access to books for people of all ages and backgrounds.

Little Free Libraries are run by volunteers.
