

Automatic Acceleration

What is Automatic Acceleration?

Auto Acceleration refers to state legislation that requires the automatic placement of students that meet or exceed standards into the next most rigorous level of coursework if the student meets or exceeds state standards in English language arts (ELA), mathematics, or science on a state assessment.

This amendment applies to grade levels 9-12.

What is the difference between college preparatory, honors and advanced placement?

College Preparatory Non-weighted Honors Weighted Advanced Placement Weighted

College Preparatory courses are taught at grade level and prepare students for access to early college experiences and post-secondary opportunities.

Honors courses are intended to offer a more challenging academic experience covering more material at an accelerated pace. These courses are designed for students who excel in certain subjects and are comfortable working independently.

Similar in rigor to honors courses. This course follows the College Board's guidelines for the subject's course. This course prepares student to take the advanced placement exam with the potential to earn college credit depending on the student's performance.

Elective Course Requests

Fremd High School is committed to ensuring your student's high school experience is enriching, academically fulfilling, and tailored to their individual interests laying the foundation for their future educational and career pursuits.

All freshmen will have a daily class schedule that includes English, math, science, wellness classes, study hall, and elective courses. Incoming freshmen will be placed into specific English, math, and science courses based on placement test scores and recommendations from 8th-grade teachers.

Steps To Select Elective Course Requests

- Review the courses listed on the back thoughtfully to maximize your student's high school experience and prepare for the post-secondary journey.
- Identify elective courses that align with your student's personal interests, academic readiness, and future goals.
- Review graduation requirements and course descriptions of your identified elective courses in the District 211 Curriculum Guide (https://adc.d211.org/curriculum-guide).
- Submit elective course requests through the D211 Infinite Campus Parent Portal.

How Do I Submit Elective Course Requests?

Parents must log on to the D211 Infinite Campus Parent Portal to request elective courses. Once logged on, click more and then click the D211 Elective Course Selection link under Quick Links.

Indicate your student's two elective course requests plus one alternate course. Alternate courses will be used if schedule conflicts prevent another course request from being honored or if elective course prerequisites have not been met. All requests are due by Wednesday, December 18.

Dear Parents/Guardians:

District 211 utilizes Infinite Campus (IC) as our student information system. Parents/Guardians use IC to stay informed about students' academic progress, report absences, register for sports and activities, and register for each academic school year. If you currently have a student enrolled in high school, you already have a functional account and do not need to set up a new account. However, an IC account from another school district will not connect with a District 211 school. Follow the steps below to create a District 211 IC parent portal account.

Creating a District 211 Infinite Campus Parent Portal Account

To create a new account, please use the activation key below. The activation key is unique to you as an individual. Each parent/guardian is receiving an individualized activation code. Create your account by visiting the District 211 Ic portal site at https://campus.d211.org/campus/portal/township.jsp. Click "Campus Parent" and then the "New User" link and follow the onscreen prompts. Please verify the accuracy of your email address in the "Family Information" section of the portal. You will not receive school-based messages unless your email address remains updated.

Do not share this activation key with your student. Student and parent accounts have different privileges in IC. Student accounts will be created by the school and students will receive that information separately, prior to the start of freshman year.

Again, if you already have an IC parent portal account with District 211 based on having another student in a District 211 high school or a student who graduated from a District 211 high school, you do not need to create another IC account. Your existing IC account will allow you to view information for all your students. If you experience problems with your existing account or cannot see all of your students in the parent portal, please contact the Student Services Office at 847-755-2630 for assistance.




