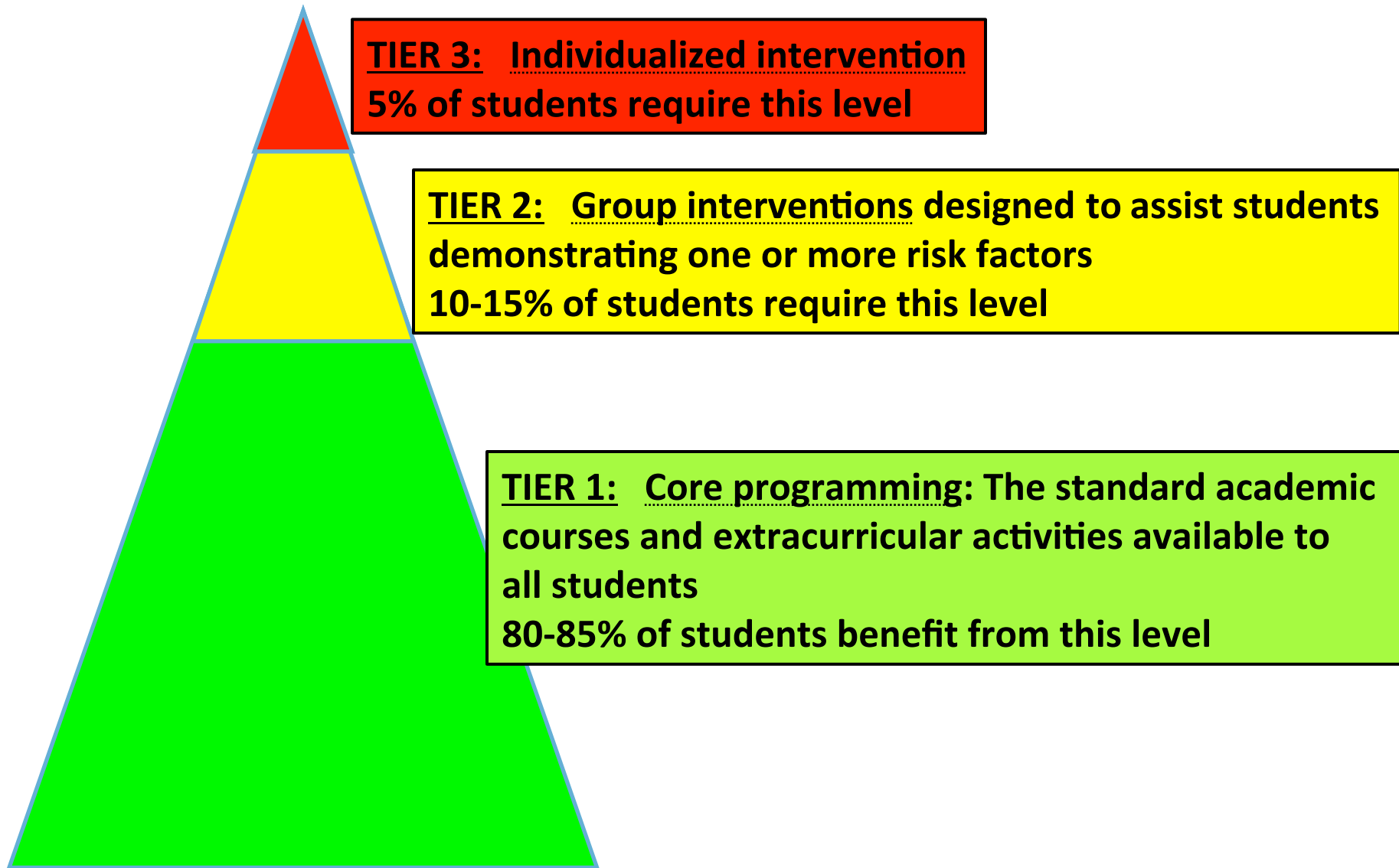

Differing Levels of Intervention



TIER 3: Individualized intervention
5% of students require this level

TIER 2: Group interventions designed to assist students demonstrating one or more risk factors
10-15% of students require this level

TIER 1: Core programming: The standard academic courses and extracurricular activities available to all students
80-85% of students benefit from this level

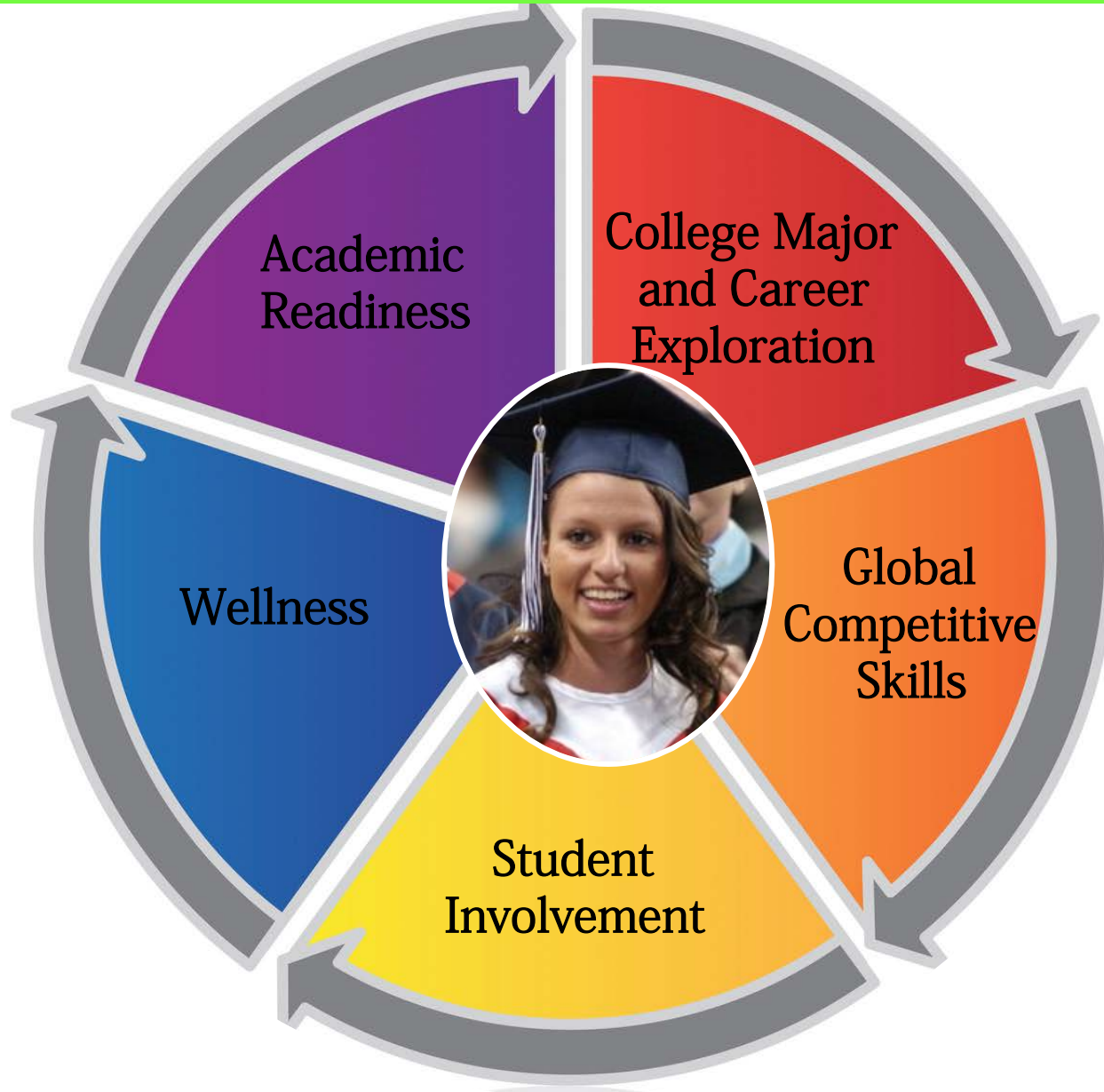

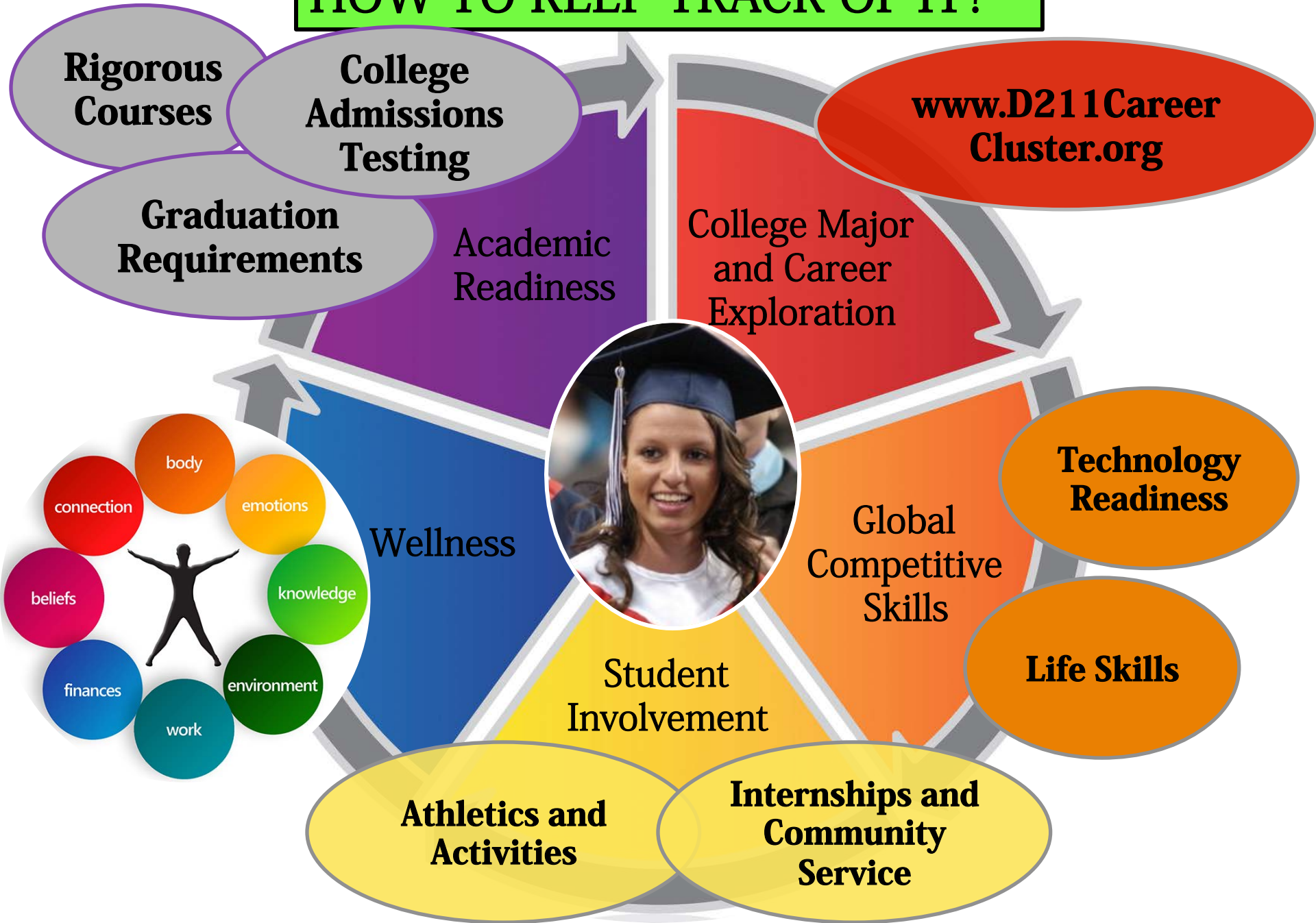

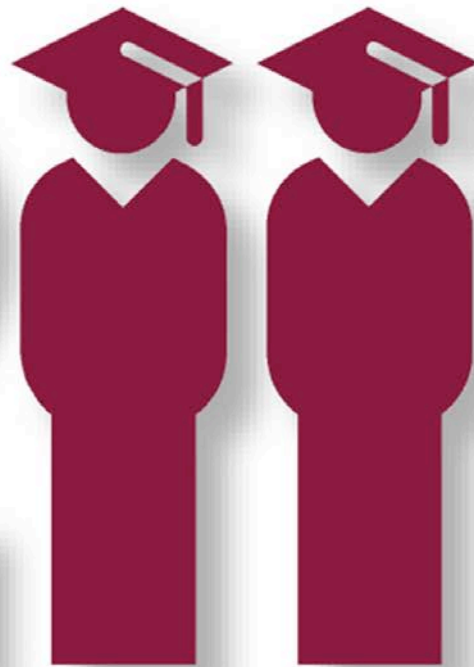
