Board of Education Meeting Recap

The Township High School District 211 Board of Education met on Thursday, October 15, 2015, in the Anne Koller Board Meeting Room at the G.A. McElroy Administration Center. The following is a recap of important items that were acted upon at the meeting.

Military Recognition

The Board of Education honored Specialist **Jakub Burzynski**, a 2015 James B. Conant High School graduate, who is currently serving in the Army Reserves. Specialist Burzynski led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Recognitions

A District 211 record 39 students from James B. Conant, William Fremd, Hoffman Estates, Palatine, and Schaumburg High Schools were honored by the Board for being named National Merit Scholars. Presentation: 2015 Tax Levy

The Board of Education viewed a <u>presentation</u> on the 2015 Tax Levy by Chief Operating Officer **Lauren Hummel** and Controller and Treasurer **Barbara Peterson**.

The Board also received tax levy information at the meeting, in addition to the materials it received at the September 17 meeting. The information presented included tax levy background information, Cook County property tax levy information, tax abatement information, the 2015 tax levy calendar, and 2015 levy considerations and CPI projections.

The Board's Budget and Finance Committee has a meeting scheduled on November 4, 2015, to further review levy materials. Additionally, at the next regular Board meeting on November 12, 2015, tax levy information will be presented again for further review and discussion. Also at that meeting, the Board will review a resolution to determine the proposed levy amount for 2015.

Class Size Committee Report

The Board of Education received a report from the Class Size Committee.

Summer School Enrollment/Cost Analysis

The Board received an update on Summer School 2015. District 211 provided learning opportunities for 13,016 students during Summer School 2015, with 7,334 students participating in classroom experiences during both semesters and 5,682 involved in athletic camps.

A highlight of the summer program was the development and implementation of the first Pathway Exploration course, Interactive and Information Technology 1, designed to introduce students to a variety of essential skills for the Information Technology professional.

The Incoming Freshman Academy was offered for the 11th year, while the Sophomore Summer Academy was offered for a 10th year. Student academies are offered to selected students at no cost and are designed to accelerate student learning in reading, writing, and mathematics.

The Applied Technology Department continued to offer a special program entitled "Project Lead the Way Summer Engineering Academy," which is designed to provide selected young students with an opportunity to participate in a three-week course that explores engineering and architecture concepts. The non-credit course was offered only to students in the summer prior to 8th grade who have shown an interest and have performed well in mathematics and science.

Community Engagement and Strategic Planning: Presentation

District and School Improvement Plans for 2015-2016

High School District 211 uses the Illinois State Board of Education's (ISBE) approved school improvement reporting system known as Rising Star. Rising Star is a comprehensive continuous improvement process system that has been fully embedded in the State's web-based school and district integrated plans on the Illinois Interactive Report Card (IIRC) that serves as the required template for a variety of plans required by both state and federal funding sources, such as Title II, Race to the Top, and technology implementation plans.

In accordance with ISBE requirements, the current District Improvement Plan and each school's improvement plan must be submitted to the Board of Education annually. The Board acknowledged receipt and granted approval of the 2015-2016 District Improvement Plan and each School Improvement Plan.
