The highest possible composite score is 36, which is achieved by less than one percent of students taking the exam. Last school year in the state of Illinois just 184 students earned a composite score of 36. I am proud to say that tonight we have four District 211 students here to be recognized for this outstanding achievement. On behalf of the Board of Education and High School District 211, we would like to congratulate each of them."
