#### **Business Partnerships for Students**

Superintendent Cates introduced Associate Superintendent for Student Services Mark Kovack. Mr. Kovack introduced Director of Special Education Renée Erickson and District 211 Transitions Services Coordinator Patrick Abraham. Mr. Abraham introduced and Ms. Erickson presented certificates to representatives from these local businesses who partner with District 211 to establish worksites for students with special needs that provide true-to-life work experiences to help prepare these students for their lives after high school: Elizabeth Blackwell School, Schaumburg; Friendship Village of Schaumburg; Innovative Components; Lifetime Fitness; Rosewood Care Center; Village of Palatine; and Willow Creek Care Center.

President Burke congratulated all the business partners who were recognized tonight on behalf of the Board of Education.
