Highest Possible Composite Score on the American College Testing (ACT) Exam

Superintendent Cates made the following comments:

"Every high school student who prepares for college is aware of the importance placed on standardized college entrance exams, including the American College Test, or the ACT. The highest possible composite score a student can earn on the ACT is a 36. Across the nation, nearly two million students took the ACT, and less than one-tenth of one percent of students who took the ACT achieved the highest score.

Tonight, we recognize three students from William Fremd High School who have achieved this remarkable accomplishment. We began tracking students who achieved a score of 36 on the ACT 20 years ago, and with the addition of these three students, we now have 125 students who have reached this outstanding achievement in District 211.

On behalf of the Board of Education and High School District 211, I would like to congratulate our three students. We have a certificate for each student that Board President Mrs. Burke will present in just a moment."

Dan was most recently recognized as the Girls Bowling Illinois State Coach of the Year by the National Federation of State High School Associations.
