Highest Possible Composite Score on the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT)

Superintendent Cates made the following comments:

"Every student who prepares for college is familiar with the emphasis placed on standardized college entrance exams, including the Scholastic Aptitude Test, or SAT as it is known. The SAT is comprised of tests in mathematics, critical reading, and writing. Each year, the SAT is taken by 1.7 million students nationally, and of those, less than 300 achieve the highest possible score.

Tonight, I am pleased to say that we have a District 211 student from Fremd High School who has joined this prestigious group of test-takers earning the highest possible score.

On behalf of the Board of Education and High School District 211, congratulations on this outstanding achievement. Board President Mrs. Burke will present you with a certificate in a moment."

Superintendent Cates introduced William Fremd High School Mathematics Teacher Jeremiah Moon. Mr. Moon introduced and President Burke presented a certificate to William Fremd High School student Maegan Jong for earning the highest possible composite score on the December 2017 Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT).

Highest Possible Composite Score on the American College Testing (ACT) Exam

Superintendent Cates made the following comments:

"We just heard about one college entrance exam, and now I'd like to talk about the other, the American College Test, or the ACT as it is commonly called. The highest possible composite score a student can earn on the ACT is a 36. Statistically, less than one-tenth of one percent of students who take the ACT achieve the highest score.

Tonight, we recognize two students from William Fremd High School who have achieved this remarkable accomplishment. Since we began tracking students who have achieved the highest possible score on the ACT 20 years ago, we now have 112 students earning this distinction.

On behalf of the Board of Education and High School District 211, I would like to congratulate our two students. We have a certificate for each that Board President Mrs. Burke will present in a moment."

Superintendent Cates introduced William Fremd High School English Teacher Christina O'Donnell. Ms. O'Donnell introduced and President Burke presented a certificate to William Fremd High School student Yoonseo Kim for earning a 36, the highest possible composite score, on the February 2018 American College Test (ACT) examination.
