# Highest Possible Composite Score on the American College Testing (ACT) Exam

Superintendent Cates made the following comments:

"Every high school student who prepares for college is aware of the importance placed on standardized college entrance exams, including the American College Test, what we all know as the ACT. The highest possible composite score a student can earn on the ACT is a 36. Statistically, less than one-tenth of one percent of students taking the ACT achieve the highest score.

For over 20 years ago, the Board of Education has recognized students who have achieved the highest score possible of 36 on the ACT. Tonight, we are excited to recognize and honor 11 students from District 211 who have achieved this remarkable accomplishment. With the addition of these 11 students, District 211 has now had 139 students who have reached this outstanding achievement.

On behalf of the Board of Education and High School District 211, I would like to congratulate our students and their families. We have a certificate for each student that Board President Mr. LeFevre will present in just a moment. Our students will each be introduced by a sponsor who they have selected."

Superintentendent Cates introduced William Fremd High School Applied Technology Teacher Michael Karasch and he made the following comments:

"Project Lead the Way, a nonprofit organization that provides a transformative learning experience for pre-kindergarten through 12th grade students and teachers across the country, announced its Outstanding Teacher award recipients for 2019-2020 during the organization's national conference this past November. To be considered for an outstanding teacher award, nominees must demonstrate a strong record of instruction that aligns with the program's goals, which include inspiring and empowering students as well as using innovative teaching methods to engage students in activity-, project-, and problem-solving-based learning.

Tonight, it is my pleasure to announce that Fremd High School Applied Technology teacher Mike Karasch was one of only 21 teachers nationwide to receive this award in the engineering category. Mike has been with Fremd High School for nearly 20 years, starting as a part-time auditorium manager in 2001 and then making the transition to full-time when he became part of Fremd High School's applied technology department in 2006.

In addition to recognizing Mike for being an outstanding teacher, we want to congratulate him on the birth of his son, Nicholas, who was born on Saturday.

On behalf of the Board of Education and the Fremd High School community, congratulations, Mike, on this outstanding honor. Thank you for engaging and inspiring our next generation of engineers. Board President Bob LeFevre has a certificate to present you for this honor."

### Young Hearts for Life

Superintendent made the following comments:

"Sudden cardiac death tragically claims the lives of more than 60 young adults in the United States each week. Young Hearts for Life has been a leader in the Chicago medical community in helping to combat this issue. Its youth heart-screening program is the largest in the country and is well known for its unique model using trained community volunteers to deliver efficient cardiac screenings. Since its inception in 2006, Young Hearts for Life has provided cardiac screenings to help prevent otherwise undetected heart conditions to approximately 220,000 students at no charge to students or families.

Following the death of Fremd High School graduate Jared Hardy in 2009 from a genetic heart condition and sudden cardiac arrest, Jared's mother, Ruth Jensen, and her foundation, the Jared Joshua Hardy Charities, worked to raise funds to offer these heart screenings to District 211 students. This Board is grateful to have been able to recognize Ruth Jensen for her contributions before she passed in 2018. Ruth's vision continues strong. Since 2016, Young Hearts for Life has screened students in all District 211 schools, providing nearly 11,000 screenings at no charge to students or families. More importantly, of those 11,000 screenings, 69 students with previously undetected heart conditions were identified for further testing or intervention.

Tonight, Young Hearts for Life founder Dr. Joseph Marek and his wife, Program Director Kathy Marek, join us. On behalf of the Board of Education and our entire District 211 community, I would like to thank both of you and the entire Young Hearts for Life organization for its continued work in helping provide our students and their families with effective cardiac screenings. Your work has made and continues to make a difference in our school communities, allowing our students to safely pursue the activities of their choice while giving their families peace of mind. Please come forward, as Board President Bob LeFevre has a certificate of appreciation for you."

President LeFevre presented a certificate to Dr. and Mrs. Marek in recognition of the Young Hearts for Life organization's work in helping to provide electrocardiogram screenings for Hypertrophic Cardiomyopathy for District 211 students at District 211 at no cost for students or their families.

President LeFevre thanked everyone for coming to the meeting tonight on behalf of the Board of Education.
