Dear Parents:

You are very important people. As you know, parenting is difficult today, given significant and on-going changes in our society and world. Frequently, teenagers need much parental support in the development of self-confidence, dependability, and self-reliance.

This brochure serves as a bridge from us to you. We offer our help, training, and cooperation so that, by working with you, your child will have the guidance necessary to become a mature, well-adjusted, and selfdisciplined young adult.

The following thoughts are intended to encourage communication and provide a frame of reference for you and your child. If you would like more information or additional assistance, please contact your child's counselor.

Whatever you do, don't give up. An undiscussed problem is unresolved — possibly forever.

Fairness

Fairness is an act of love. Parents are responsible for establishing an atmosphere of mutual respect and trust.

- ▲ Listen you don't have to agree, but it helps if you understand.
- ▲ Remember everyone has a say, but not necessarily his or her way.
- Model children should see what you want them to be.
- ▲ Keep an open mind.

Friendliness

Friendliness is an act of love. Parents set the tone for a warm, accepting environment.

- ▲ Enjoy your child.
- Encourage healthy, responsible decision-making.
- ▲ Understand and support your child's need for increasing independence.
- Expect mistakes and mutually learn from them.
- ▲ Take time to spend with your child, one on one.

Firmness

Firmness is an act of love. Parents are often expected to take an unpopular, but appropriate, position on difficult issues.

- ▲ Structure is not confining, but allows them to explore safely.
- ▲ Agree in advance to limits and logical consequences.
- ▲ Follow through on agreed upon consequences.
- Affirm and recognize personal growth in yourself and in your child.
- ▲ Act. Don't merely threaten to act.

Flexibility

Flexibility is an act of love. As responsibility increases, parents set limits for expanding freedom.

- ▲ Allow yourself to be persuaded, but not bullied.
- ▲ Respect your child's viewpoint.
- ▲ Practice shared problem-solving.
- ▲ Become an approachable parent.
- ▲ Adolescence is a developmental stage; responding to their needs is a process.
- ▲ Take time. Adolescents expect immediate decisions. Show them how to consider the big picture.
