Introduction

All students residing in High School District 211 may enroll in our tuition Summer School program. Summer School provides opportunities for students to improve academic skills and to explore new interests. It also enables incoming freshmen to become familiar with the high school routine.

Online registration begins on April 15 at 7:00 a.m. for Conant, Hoffman Estates, and Schaumburg High Schools and April 17 at 7:00 a.m. for Palatine and Fremd High Schools. Please register **early**. Walk-in registration also is available (see page 3 for office hours.) Decisions to run most classes will be made by May 31. Class sizes must be limited, and classes will close when the limit is reached. Classes with insufficient enrollment will be cancelled.

Online: First Semester Registration — Online registration begins April 15 at 7:00 a.m. for all current freshmen, sophomores, and juniors at **CHS, SHS,** and **HEHS** and closes at 3:00 p.m. on June 3.

Online registration begins April 17 at 7:00 a.m. for all current freshmen, sophomores, and juniors at **PHS,** and **FHS** and closes at 3:00 p.m. on June 3.

Second Semester Registration — Online registration begins April 15 at 7:00 a.m. for current freshmen, sophomores, and juniors at **CHS, SHS,** and **HEHS** and closes at 3:00 p.m. on June 25.

Online registration begins April 17 at 7:00 a.m. for all current freshmen, sophomores, and juniors at **PHS** and **FHS** and closes at 3:00 p.m. on June 25.

Incoming Freshmen Summer School Registration

Summer School registration begins April 22 for all incoming freshmen. All registration hours and closing dates apply. Registration must be completed at the school the student will attend in the fall.

Walk-in: All registration dates apply. Current and incoming District 211 students must register at their home high school (see page 3 for office hours).

Parochial school students who live in High School District 211 boundaries may register for academic classes at the Administration Center on the first day of registration.

How: After students have met with their counselor and have made course selections, registration can be completed for students at the high school they will attend during the 2019-2020 school year **OR** online. Online payment is available for District 211 families by using the Infinite Campus Parent Portal found on your child’s home school website. Online payment can be made by credit card using Visa, MasterCard, Discover, or American Express. Parents desiring to complete registration online may do so by using the same username and password that has been previously provided. Walk-in and online registrations must adhere to deadlines as stated. Payment for walk-in registrations may be done by cash, check, or credit card.

Transportation: Students who pay in person for transportation will receive a temporary bus pass upon payment at the school where they register. If payment for transportation is made online, parents will be notified via email when a bus route has been assigned. The student then needs to see their counselor to get a temporary bus pass. A permanent bus pass will be issued to eligible students on the first day of attendance.

Academic Refund Policy

Students may receive a 100% refund if they withdraw from a full-tuition academic course before the first class meeting.

Students enrolled in Summer School may receive a partial refund for only the following reasons:

- any long-term illness or injury causing withdrawal from Summer School. The refund request must be accompanied by a doctor's verification of the medical condition causing withdrawal.
- a death in the immediate family.

Academic Courses (13-day courses)

If request for refund occurs within:

- 1-4 days (2/3 of tuition)
- 5-8 days (1/3 of tuition)
- 9-13 days (No refund)

Driver Education & Physical Education (Make-up) (26-day courses)

If request for refund occurs within:

- 1-8 days (2/3 of tuition)
- 9-16 days (1/3 of tuition)
- 17-26 days (No refund)

Academic refund checks for 1st semester will be issued on or near July 5, 2019, and 2nd semester on or near July 29, 2019.

NO REFUNDS WILL BE GIVEN FOR ANY OTHER REASONS.

A school administrator and the District Summer School administrator must approve all refunds which will be subject to a review of initial payment.

ORIGINAL BUS PASS MUST BE SURRENDERED TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR A FULL TRANSPORTATION REFUND. *Refund requests missing a bus pass will be delayed until the pass is returned.*

Food Service Options

Breakfast, lunch, and à la carte options are available to all students attending Summer School. A complimentary breakfast will be available to all students before the start of school each morning. Additionally, Palatine and Schaumburg High Schools qualify for the USDA's Seamless Summer meal program, which allows these schools to offer a free lunch to all students attending these high schools' Summer School programs, as well as any child under the age of 18 in the community. More information on these programs can be found on the district's webpage. Fremd and Conant High School will offer a complete lunch daily for \$3.00. All lunch meals include an entrée, servings of fruits and vegetables, and milk. A la carte offerings in the cafeteria and vending machines also will be available.

If your child is new to District 211 this summer, an application for the free and reduced meal program for school year 2018-2019 is accessible online at <http://adc.d211.org/page/6669> or a hardcopy is available at each school. Please remember that a new application will need to be completed prior to the 2019-2020 school year. This new application will be available in mid-July.

District 211 students attending Summer School will have access to their food service prepayment accounts. Students may make a payment in the cafeteria using cash. Deposits to prepayment accounts can be made using cash or check payments only during Summer School. **Online credit card payments will not be accepted during Summer School and will resume prior to the start of the 2019-2020 school year.** If you have any questions about the food service options available to your child, please call the Food & Nutrition Services Department at 847-755-6681.

Transportation

District 211 school buses will run for morning credit classes only. District transportation is not provided for afternoon classes. The fee is \$35 for one semester, \$70 for both semesters. **Because of irregular schedules, students in driver education classes may not be able to benefit from bus service.**

Summer School Regulations

Frequently Asked Questions

Summer School is an academic enrichment program for students who desire additional learning opportunities. Time is precious; each day is equivalent to a week of study during the regular school year. Rules are enforced strictly, quickly, and consistently to maintain an atmosphere conducive to learning. There will be no exceptions made to the rules of conduct or attendance.

What kind of behavior is expected?

During the summer, behavior expectations are the same as during the school year. Students may not wear hats and coats in school. Students who use or possess tobacco or controlled substances; are truant or excessively tardy; or commit acts of gross misconduct will be immediately dismissed from Summer School. These students will forfeit credit and fees for the semester.

Summer School Regulations (continued)

Are students required to wear I.D.s?

Students are required to wear and properly display a current school I.D. card while attending Summer School in District 211. Student I.D. cards will be distributed on the first day of class. The I.D. card must be worn around the neck and visible at all times during the school day except when specifically exempted on a temporary basis by an authorized faculty /staff member. Only lanyards issued by the school may be used to wear and display the I.D. card. Students may not embellish their I.D. card with any drawing or writing. I.D. cards must be surrendered upon request of any staff member, including bus drivers and student supervisors. The I.D. card must be shown to the staff member on duty when entering buses, checking out media materials, and leaving the school for any purpose. Students without an I.D. card on a school-issued lanyard must obtain a replacement card or lanyard immediately upon entering the building. A fee of \$3.00 may be charged to replace a lost or invalid I.D. card or school lanyard, and a fee of \$1.00 may be charged for each day that a student fails to wear the I.D. card to school. Further disciplinary consequences may apply for failure to properly wear and display a current I.D. card.

Are electronic devices allowed?

Students are permitted to possess electronic communication devices (e.g. cellular telephones, pagers, personal digital assistants, or any hybrid communication device) while on school property. "School property" includes the school building, parking lots and grounds, and school-owned vehicles. **However, these devices must be turned off and stored out of sight (backpack, purse, not visible to anyone) during school hours.**

What are the attendance rules?

- A student who misses the first two days of a Summer School semester will not be allowed to attend class that semester.
- A student who misses the first two days of a Summer School semester will forfeit all tuition and fees.
- Upon obtaining a third absence (or any combination of absences/tardies equaling three absences), a student will be **dropped** from Summer School.
- A tardy of one hour or less is recorded as one-half day of absence; more than one hour equals a full day. Students arriving late or leaving early must report to the attendance office.

- Do not schedule summer vacations during the Summer School session.
- Students dropped from class do not receive refunds.
- To report an absence or ask a question, please call the Summer School office at the school the student is attending.

What are the study requirements?

Students should expect a great deal of homework each day. Absentees must turn in missed work immediately upon their return to school.

What is the final examination policy?

A student who is absent on the last day of the semester will not be allowed to take the final examination and will not receive course credit. In addition, the student will forfeit all fees for the entire semester and receive a failing grade by default. Final examinations will be given during the last two hours of class. **Final examinations will not be given early.**

How much credit does a course earn?

Students receive one-half unit of credit for each semester of an academic course. Driver education courses and physical education earn one-quarter unit of credit for the course.

What does "audit" mean?

Students may apply to audit a course. A notation will appear on the school record that the student attended the course and received no credit. Audit students pay full fee and must adhere to the same attendance guidelines. Audit forms are obtained from the Summer School principal.

How does a student register for a class?

Current students should contact their counselor to enroll in Summer School. Parents should contact their child's counselor for an appointment, if desired. New students should contact the student services office at the school they will attend in the fall. District 211 Summer School is not available to students entering grade 8 or below.

Applied Technology

T272/T672 Networking: IT Fundamentals

Levels: All

1/2 unit of credit

This course provides students with a hand-on introduction to operating systems and related concepts. Includes hardware, software, file systems, directory structures, files and attributes, text editors, applications and maintenance. Compares and contrasts GUI and command line interfaces in a variety of current operating systems. *T67203: Harper College Course NET 105*

IT Fundamentals, 3 college credits.

Palatine High School – 1st semester

Art

A153 Art

Levels: All

1/2 unit of credit

This course is the equivalent to the first semester of Painting, Drawing, and Printmaking 1 offered during the regular school year. Students will learn the basics of drawing, color, and design through a variety of projects and materials.

Schaumburg High School — 2nd Semester

A195 Digital Media Arts 1

Levels: All

1/2 unit of credit

Digital Media Arts 1 is the beginning level course and introduction to digital arts and imaging. Students will begin to learn key concepts and basic skills involving digital photography and imaging, digital illustration/vector, graphic design, raster/bitmap imagery, virtual worlds, motion graphics, and game design. Lessons will be geared towards learning tool and technique basics using industry standard software such as Photoshop, Illustrator, Final Cut Pro, and Unity as students investigate the essentials of interactive media. No experience necessary. This introductory semester course is suggested as a pairing with the introductory semester course A196 Video and Animation.

Schaumburg High School — 1st Semester

A902 Photography

Levels: 2,3,4

1/2 unit of credit

This enrichment course in black and white photography features cameras, composition, and darkroom techniques and may include digital photography. Students must purchase supplies at their own expense and must have access to a 35mm black and white camera. This course may be used in place of *Photography A255* as a prerequisite for *A355 Photo II* during the regular school year. Prerequisite for level 1: Department chair or teacher recommendation.

Business Education

B952 Online Keyboarding

Levels: All

1/4 unit of credit

Online Keyboarding is a six-week course delivered online via the Internet, email, and five two-hour face to face meetings with the instructor. You will need reliable Internet access with a standard keyboard. Students will learn to key the alphabetic keys by touch (without looking at the keyboard) to increase speed and accuracy.

NOTE: You will be required to attend five sessions with your teacher throughout the six-week period. Please enroll in this course only if you can attend all five sessions. No transportation will be provided for this afternoon class.

B285 Consumer Education

Levels: 2,3,4

1/2 unit of credit

Students will receive instruction in budgeting, savings and investing, credit, insurance, economics, comparison shopping, banking, income taxes, and consumer protection. As referenced on page 6 of the Summer School Catalog, students should expect at least 2 hours of homework each day. Out of school Internet access to accommodate the accelerated curriculum schedule is required. This course fulfills the Consumer Education graduation requirement.

Driver Education

P902 Driver Education (Behind the Wheel & Classroom)

Levels: 2,3,4

1/4 unit of credit

To enroll in this program, students must be 16 years of age by September 30, 2019. **All students should have a valid Illinois learner's permit on the first day of class.** State law requires that all students must have received a passing grade in eight courses during the two semesters prior to enrolling in driver education. Both classroom and behind-the-wheel instruction are offered. Seats are limited in all sections. **Early registration for this course is essential.** Only residents of High School District 211 are eligible for this course.

Those who do not attend a District 211 high school during the regular school year must register at the G.A. McElroy Administration Center, 1750 S. Roselle Road, in Palatine, and bring a copy of their birth certificate and verification of academic eligibility. (Obtain this form from your own school's administration.)

Because of irregular schedules, students may not be able to benefit from bus service. Bus transportation is not available for afternoon classes that begin at 1:45 p.m.

All Schools — June 4 - July 18

Hoffman Estates High School classes will be held at Conant High School

Meeting times vary at all schools; students will receive a class schedule on the first day of class.

P912 Driver Education (Classroom Only)

Levels: 2,3,4

1/4 unit of credit

To enroll in this program, students must be 16 years of age by September 30, 2019. State law requires that all students must have received a passing grade in eight courses during the two semesters prior to enrolling in driver education.

Because of irregular schedules, students may not be able to benefit from bus service. Bus transportation is not available for afternoon classes that begin at 1:45 p.m.

All Schools — June 4 - July 18

Hoffman Estates High School classes will be held at Conant High School

Meeting times vary at all schools; students will receive a class schedule on the first day of class.

English

E101/E102 English

Levels: 2,3,4

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

This course is for students who need to make up freshman English credit. It focuses on literature, composition, and language.

Fremd High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Schaumburg High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

E201/E202 English

Levels: 3,4

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

This course is for students who need to make up sophomore English credit. It focuses on the study of literature, composition, and language. Units of speech and communication are part of the work at this level.

Fremd High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Schaumburg High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

E301/E302 English

Level: 4

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

This course is for students who need to make up junior English credit. It includes work on writing and the study of American literature. Students will learn research skills and complete a short research project each semester.

Fremd High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Schaumburg High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

E422 English

Level: 4

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

Each semester of this course satisfies one semester of the senior-level English requirement for those who need to make up senior English credit for graduation. First semester covers a survey of English literature. Second semester includes improvement of writing skills.

Fremd High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Schaumburg High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Health Education

P242 Health Education

Levels: 3,4

1/2 unit of credit

Health Education is a required course for graduation by the Illinois State Board of Education. The course provides students with current health information that discusses physical, mental, emotional, and social health issues. Emphasis is given to the development of healthy lifestyles which will provide students with the opportunity to achieve their full potential as human beings.

All Schools — 1st or 2nd Semester

Hoffman Estates High School classes will be held at Schaumburg High School

Mathematics

M114 Algebra I

Level: 2

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

This course introduces students to the fundamental principles of algebra.

Fremd High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Schaumburg High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

M117 Algebra I

Level: 2

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

This course is available for students wishing to retake because of a failing grade or desiring to improve academic achievement.

Fremd High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Schaumburg High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

M214 Plane and Solid Geometry

Levels: 2,3,4

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

This study of geometry involves studying the axioms and theorems that relate points, lines, planes, and solids. An overview of plane and solid geometry is presented through geometric constructions, measurement formulas, and limited writing of formal proofs.

Fremd High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Schaumburg High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

M217 Plane and Solid Geometry

Level: 2

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

This comprehensive study of plane and solid geometry includes constructions, formulas for measurement, and formal proofs. It is based on the axioms and theorems that relate points, line, planes, and solids. Algebraic techniques are integrated into the solution of many geometric problems. Prerequisite: *M117 Algebra 1* (A,B,C) or acceptable performance on algebra examinations is required.

Fremd High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Schaumburg High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

M314 Algebra 2

Levels: 3,4

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

This course reviews topics introduced in *M114 Algebra 1* and expands upon them. The topics include methods of solving equations and inequalities, graphing techniques, and logarithms. A graphing calculator is required. Prerequisite: *Previous enrollment in M314*. **Note: This course is for credit replacement only. Sophomores and juniors who enroll in this course during Summer School must continue their study of mathematics to continue their preparation for college and career readiness.**

Fremd High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Schaumburg High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

M317 Algebra 2

Levels: 3,4

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

This course is designed for students who are proficient in topics from *M117 Algebra 1*. The ideas presented involve advanced techniques of graphing, methods of solving equations and inequalities, and functions. Students are prepared to begin their study of pre-calculus. This course requires a graphing calculator. Prerequisite: *Previous enrollment in M317*. **Note: This course is for credit replacement only. Sophomores and juniors who enroll in this course during Summer School must continue their study of mathematics to continue their preparation for college and career readiness.**

Fremd High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Schaumburg High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

M438 Trigonometry/Calculus A

Levels: 2,3,4

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

The **first semester** of this course covers trigonometry for students preparing to take *M449 AP Calculus AB* the following fall. **Prerequisites for Semester 1:** Department chair or teacher recommendation. The **second semester** of this course covers limits, derivatives, and applications of derivatives in preparation for *Advanced Placement Calculus* coursework in the fall. Second semester requires a graphing calculator. Students enrolled in this class during second semester Summer School must be recommended to be enrolled in *M449* or *M479* for the fall. Final placement will be determined by their Summer School teacher. **Prerequisites for Semester 2:** *M408, M417, M438* (1st semester), and department chair approval.

Fremd High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Schaumburg High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Physical Education

P903 Physical Education (Make-Up)

Levels: 3,4

1/4 unit of credit

Students who must repeat physical education to qualify for graduation may take this course. Activities vary according to abilities and interests of the students enrolled in class. Bus service is **not** available for this course, which meets in the afternoon. Classes begin Tuesday, June 4.

An efficacy-trained instructor will work with the teacher in the classroom to help students develop skills to reach their capacity as a student and as an individual.

Level: 1

1/2 unit of credit

1/2 unit of credit

This course provides students an opportunity to observe selected occupations within a health care setting. Students will attend 13, three and one-half hour sessions under the supervision of the Harper College instructor. W691 Introduction to Human Diseases (Dual Credit)

Level: 4

1/2 unit of credit

Prerequisite: Successful completion of freshmen biology (S131, S137, S138)

This course provides an introduction to common disease states and their treatments from a pharmacist's perspective. It includes hands-on activities related to patient assessment and education regarding these diseases. The course is designed to allow students to explore the role of the pharmacist as a member of the healthcare team. Knowledge of high school biology is assumed. Primary Care Medical Experience

A field trip to a local hospital will show the integration between hospital-based medical activities with primary care. This workshop has a limited capacity and daily attendance is required. 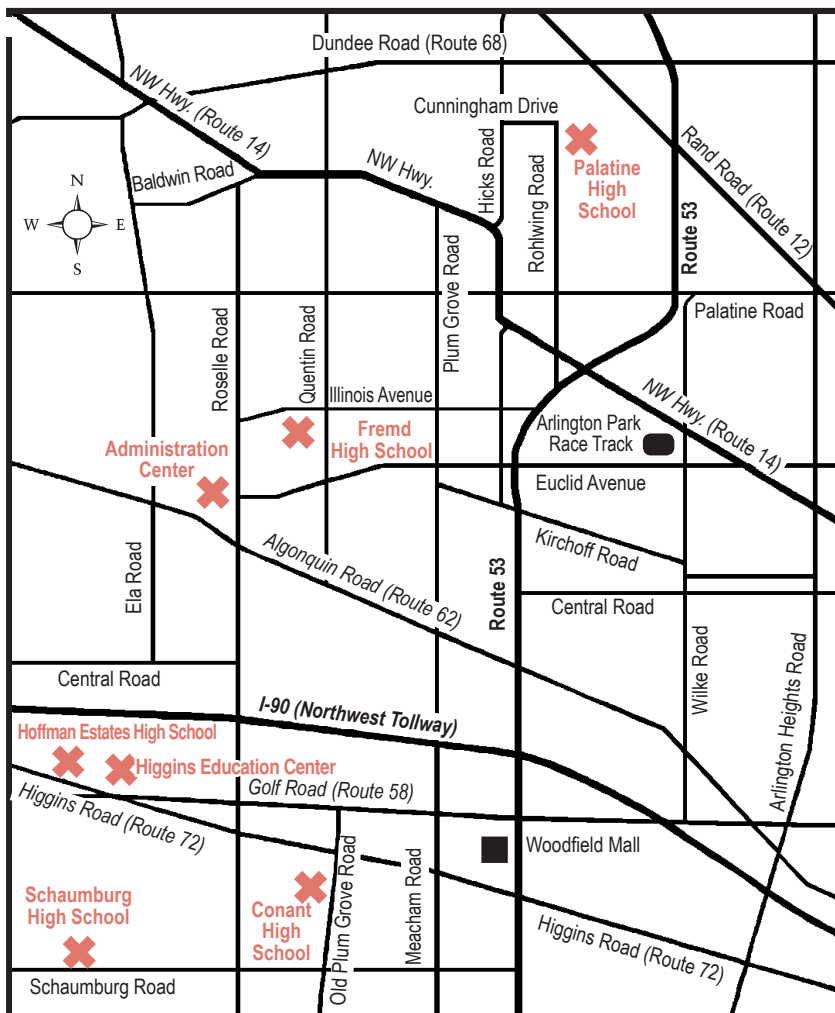
