### Dear District 211 Parents:

Summer School 2020 registration will begin this week. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, District 211 will be offering summer school courses through remote learning, as in-person instruction will not be available. Unfortunately, a few academic courses will not be offered (see end of this communication), as well as all athletic and activity camps.

As in previous summers, summer school will have a four-day week session, with a total of 26 days – 13 days each semester. There is no change to the dates for summer school. First semester will take place from Tuesday, June 2 through Tuesday, June 23. Second semester will begin on Wednesday, June 24 and continue through Wednesday, July 15. No classes will be held on Fridays. The Summer School 2020 experience will be different from the current e-learning environment. **Students will need to be available online from 8:00-11:30 a.m. each day of summer school.** Summer school is a condensed timeframe in which students only enroll in one course per 13-day semester. Your child's teacher will be interacting with your child via Zoom meetings during the 8:00-11:30 a.m. timeframe. The teacher will lead the time from 8:00-11:30 a.m. by scheduling a variety of interactions. There will be full class instruction, small group instruction, independent work time and breaks, etc. built into this timeframe.

Parents of incoming freshman who enroll in summer school will receive information about iPad pick up beginning in late May. This process will occur at the high school and will have social distancing protocols in place. Internet connectivity is vital for your child to have a successful summer school. If you need assistance with Internet connections, please do not hesitate to contact the Student Services office at your high school.

In most cases, your child pre-selected their academic class for summer school with their counselor during the regular school year. These selections can be seen in Infinite Campus once the registration window opens. Please contact the Student Services office or counselor at your child's home high school if you have questions on your child's recommended course. Incoming freshmen students may select from the academic courses for summer school designated level 1, and students who have been identified for participation in the Incoming Freshmen Academy program (no fee) will have these courses available in the online registration system in Infinite Campus as well. You may use the online system via Infinite Campus to register for the course and pay associated fees. If your child is scheduled for a class that requires no fee, **the registration process must still be completed.** Any family concerned with the cost of any summer school course should contact their Student Service's office for assistance.

To register online for summer school course offerings, District 211 parents should use the Infinite Campus Parent Portal. You can access the Infinite Campus Parent Portal here, or through either the District website or through your high school's website. If you have lost or misplaced your activation key (parents of incoming freshman) or login information for Infinite Campus, you may contact the Student Services office at your high school. For further questions, options regarding your child's summer school courses or how to pay by check, please contact your school's Student Services office.
